Summary of Important Discussions:

- *Deputy Prosecutor Esther Milner negotiates contract agreement with rep from County's on-call Engineering firm; Licensing Dept. doorway, Fairground barns, Jail geo-thermal to benefit*
- *Coroner presents Snohomish County autopsy services contract for approval, shows signs of a too-busy week, is excited about imminent purchase of Radox machine for drug testing.*

1:32 - On-Call Engineering Contract Finalized - *EM discusses several modifications which T,D&H representative SM readily agrees to. They include payment per task rather than by the month, eliminating personal liability for BOCC, a 30-day deadline for providing pertinent documents following payment for services, and changing some language aimed at private sector customers. The first project awaiting the on-call engineer's advice: cutting into a 14" wall in the new Licensing Dept. office to provide a second exit. Next will be adding beams to Fairgrounds barns. The jail's geo-thermal system replacement or repair is the "big one" on the list.*

2:20 - Approval of minutes from 4-18-23 Commissioners meeting - *AH asks to remove "He thought an online auction would have better returns" following the line "Commissioner Hover asked if they had to have an in-person auction".*

2:31 - Contract with Snohomish County for Autopsies - *DR arrives, says his week has been interesting. JN: You've been busier than you should have been. DR: I think that it's a competition for who can die at the furthest reaches of the county. Like way the (expletive) up—he's cut off by a reminder that their discussion is being recorded. Says it must be the sleep deprivation. The Snohomish County contract under discussion is identical to last year's except for: the price—\$1,300 instead of \$1,100 per autopsy; a "pay as you go" instead of steady monthly rate that gets adjusted, facilitating paperwork required for a 40% State reimbursement; prolonging the contract to three-years. Contract is approved. DR: They've been working out really well. We're into year three. It's ideal for us. He talks about the upcoming purchase through Public Health of a second*

generation Randox machine for drug-testing, says this gives quantitative as well as qualitative results and can save them the up-to-six month waiting period for blood test results. Jokes about exchanging services with Snohomish.
